Congratulations to Raidyn, Joshua and Grace on achieving this important milestone!






Year 6 into 7 Transition

RAP Girls' Cricket Report

RAP once again played Girls' Cricket in Leeton on the 14th March, with the under-strength team consisting of Josephine (ACS), Brooke (APCS), Dakota (BCS), Georgia (APCS), Charlotte (APCS), Ainslie (HCS), Bianca (BCS) and Sinead (APCS).

We rather unexpectedly trounced Narrandera in our first game, setting them a smallish total of 58 runs in our first innings but taking only 16 overs to bowl them all out for 36. Josephine was our highest run scorer with 18 runs and we were assisted by 22 extras from the opposition. In the 2nd innings, Georgia took four wickets and a catch, Charlotte took three, and one each went to Josephine, Ainslie and Dakota. Two catches also went to Josephine, and one each to Brooke and Dakota. We were very fortunate to have been loaned a player from the opposition who also took three catches!

In the second game against Leeton, we were not quite so successful with our run-scoring, despite being assisted with 22 extras again. Josephine had the top run score with six runs to make a total of 33 for RAP. Leeton, who were a full strength team, were able to make 8/34 in 12 overs, though we contributed less extras. Dakota took four wickets, and Ainslie and Georgia each got two, with Georgia taking two catches and Josephine and Charlotte also getting one each.

As always, it was a great social day for our RAP girl cricketers, with great teamwork and sportsmanship.

We look forward to playing again in 2023!

School success starts with attendance

REMINDER:

 If your child is absent from school there is a requirement for you to provide a reasonable explanation for the absence within seven days. It is the Principal's discretion as to whether they deem an explanation as reasonable.

If an explanation is not received the students' absence will automatically be recorded as unjustified.

- Absences include late arrivals and early departures to and from school which also require an explanation.
- Absence notification methods that are acceptable are: Verbal (telephone or in person), reply text to school Sentral, email or written note.
- If your child is absent because of illness for more than three consecutive days you will be required to provide a medical certificate with your absence notification.
- At times there may be a requirement for your children to be absent for extended periods of time. If this is the case you will need to contact the principal and complete an application form for extended leave prior to the leave that is being taken. It is the principal's discretion whether this application will be approved or declined.




